Mrs. Edith Lundeen is enjoying a visit with her nephew, Mr. W. Freys, from Minn.

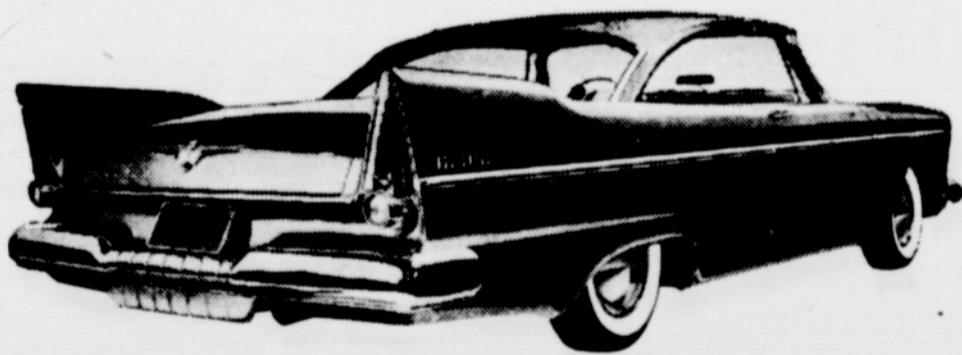
## CHURCH OF CHRIST NEWS
