Simply crochet an entry for one or more of the 16 classifications. Each entry awarded a Nationwide Crochet Contest Blue Ribbon as First Prize Winner in one of these classifications is eligible for the Best of Fair trophy (illustrated) plus the National Finals in New York City. To be eligible for judging, your article must be made of mercerized crochet cotton in any size thread up to and including 100, and must be completed this year.



Immediately after the judging at our Fair, we will report the names of the winners in all classifications to the National Needlecraft Bureau. The Bureau will then send official forms and instructions to our winners, for insuring and mailing their pieces to New York for the national judging. The Bureau will insure all entries while they are in their possession.
