

PRIZE LIST ANNOUNCED

The final prize list of the Brookings handicap bowling tournament was announced this week by Glen Rogers, Azalea Lanes operator.

Rogers reported that the tourney had 59 team entries, 149 doubles entries, and 298 singles entries.

There were 30 Women team entries, 61 women double entries, and 122 singles.

First prize winner in the teams was Mellon Millwork, Smith River, who netted \$250.00, followed by Ward's Gas and Appliance, Brookings, who had a \$180 purse.

Louis Anderson and Ken Hebered, Roseburg placed first in doubles with a 1256, good for \$150.

Del Christianson and Gertie Riggs, Medford were high in the Women's doubles with a 1137.

Butch Elliot, Coos Bay, and Maxine McCall, Medford, captured the women's singles, and All-Events, with a 604, and a 1728 respectively.

People in the Gold Beach area signified their intentions to fight any diversion of the Rogue water earlier.

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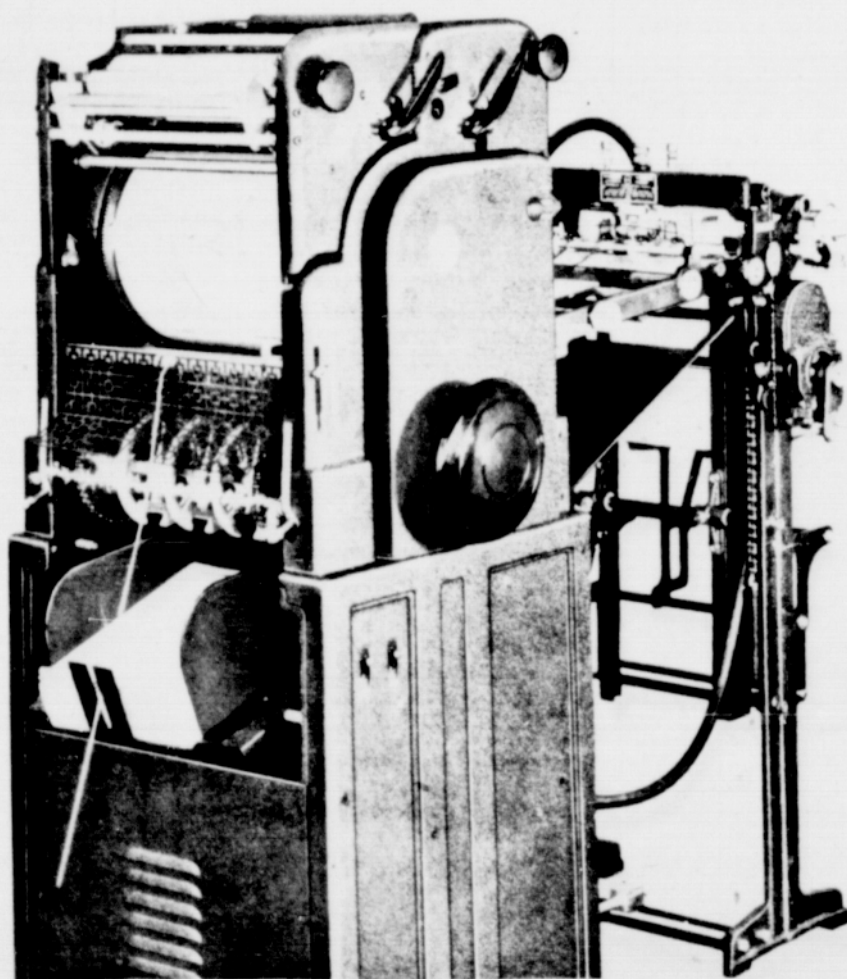
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
