DRIVING WITHOUT FEAR

Lesson No. 2 of a series prepared for by the Highway Life-savers Committee of Oregon.

Where to look? A person learning to drive for the first time will automatically try to

line up the ornament on the front of his automobile or some such object on the vehicle, and sight that down the center of his half of the road. NEVER do this; the result is you are first heading to one side of the road and then the other, turning the wheel first hard this way and then hard that way.

There is only one way to look, as far as you can see ahead in the country and then a little bit further, the same applies in

town, which will be governed by the density of traffic, but at least a block.

The reason for this is, you will never be taken by surprise. You will see a child playing with a ball on the sidewalk long before you are close to the child. Being aware of the presence of the child playing, you are therefore not taken by surprise when he darts out after the ball in front of your car. An accident, maybe a life has been saved.

The same way you will see a car coming down a side road out in front of you, long before we get there. In the city, the same, we see maybe two cars ahead of us, someone crossing

the sidewalk heading for the street, when they step out in front of us, we again are not taken by surprise. Another accident has been avoided by just knowing where to look and how to hold your steering wheel.
