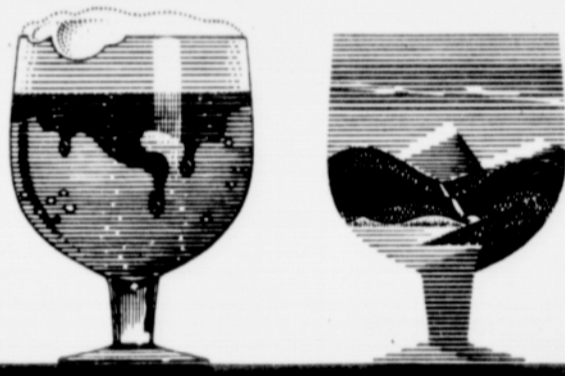
The Robert Bros. Shows are in Brookings again, and we be here through Sunday.
