Colonel Jackson Graham, Portland Engineer, has notified all navigation interests that due to current construction activities, navigation at the Chetco River bar will be closed about July 15, and will remain so until about Nov. 1. No further elaboration of the announcement was made, al-

though it is assumed that in another few days the south jetty will be about at the mouth of the river, and will make the entrance difficult if not impassable.

Two rubble-mound jetties are being constructed at the river's mouth by F. L. Somers of Medford, at a cost of \$332,600.

The Brookings Port Commissioner received official word of the closure announcement on Thursday.

The Port Commission called the Army Engineers in Portland to get a clarification of the closure, and the government people reported that the closure is more

formal than authoritative. They reported that it was likely that the mouth wouldn't be closed very long, if at all to local navigation. They said that they hadn't realized that the river was being used commercially now.
