DRIVING WITHOUT FEAR

Lesson No. 3
How to make a right turn properly, thereby safely.

(One of a series of articles prepared by the Highway Lifesavers Committee of Oregon Citizens)

When turning to the right, a driver always keeps well to his right on the inside or right hand lane. Never swing out to the left just before making the turn, which shows you are travelling too fast to make the turn safely.

Which brings up a point that few of us realize that when we are in the city; that as often as not we are driving in high gear when we should be in second. You see, first or low gear is from zero to ten or fifteen miles an hour.

Second is for speeds ten on up to twenty five or thirty miles per hour, while high is from there on up.

So it is quite obvious that if you try to make a turn in high gear, you are doing one or two things you shouldn't. Either you are taking a wide sweeping turn, which is illegal and dangerous, or you are running your engine too slow in high gear, which is hard on all the mechanical parts of an automobile.

A good driver will keep in second gear all the time when in the car. You can stop quicker, and get away quicker. In other downtown traffic. It's so much easier to drive, both for you and words, you have complete control of your vehicle at all times in heavy traffic.
