

HOLLANDERS VISIT HERE

Three visiting agricultural specialists from the Netherlands made a cooks tour of the bulb farms here.

The three, Dr. G. A. Stender, Dr. G. Kakebeeke, and Dr. H. Slits, were accompanied while in Oregon by Clark Hammon, of the State Dept. of Agriculture, and while in the Brookings area by Dinty Moore, and Sylvia Lee, of the county extension service.

The Dutchmen were in this country to study modern means of mechanization, and machinery used in agriculture here.

Dr. Kakebeeke, who is a Rotarian himself spoke Tuesday to the Brookings Rotary club.

He told them that agriculture is so much different in his country because of the small acreage. A good sized farm in the Netherlands is 25 acres.

Much of their fruit is grown under glass, he reported, and over 10,000 acres of land is in greenhouses. He said that every square inch of land is used.

Dr. Kakebeeke told about the reclamation of land from the Zuider Zee, and said that about 500,000 acres would be reclaimed by 1970. The government of the Netherlands is interested in seeking new machinery, and new methods because of a shortage of farm help there.

Also farmers must contend with a shortage of what the Dr. called "sweet water", despite the fact that rainfall there is fairly high.

Asked about his impressions of the United States he reported that he was mainly impressed with the many cars, the fine new highways, the efficiency of some of our methods, and the very kind hospitality that we have shown to them.

CURRY TO GET \$62,155 MORE IN BASIC SCHOOL SUPPORT

Curry County will get a total of \$364,458 this coming year in basic school support as compared with \$302,303 last year, an increase of \$62,155.

The figures showing the increase came from the Department of Education, and were printed in the Oregon Voter.

The increase is due to the new basic support formula, which calls for \$95 per census child, compared with the old formula which schools received \$80 per census child.
