We walked over to Region I where they had a replica of the Mayflower. Then after dinner we had another campfire. It was the

"Talents of Scouts" night and was interesting.

Next morning after breakfast there was an aerial show put on by the Air Force Thunderbirds who fly F100C Super Sabres. The rest of the day passed quickly, with not much to do but visit the other areas.

That night we had a sectional campfire.

The next day or two was spent on the rifle range, archery range and skeet shoot.

The last day we washed clothes until noon then we ate and started

packing, but it wasn't until four o'clock that we tore our camp down. That night we had a box dinner and went to the closing ceremony where they had all the Canadian Scouts on stage and the story of Baden-Powell and the 100 years of scouting was told.
