**\$90,000 FOR HARBOR STUDY

**BUILDING PERMITS NEEDED

Now as it stands—a quick recapitulation—Brookings has channel 8, Eureka has channel 6 with the possibility of a second station there—and the Oregon broadcasting Co. (KIEM) is left holding a transmitter.

There seems to be little likelihood that anyone will make any use out of Channel 8 in the near future.
