HARVARD PROFESSOR VISITS KALMIOPSIS AREA  
Dr. I. Mackenzie Lamb, Professor of Botany & director of the Farlow Herbarium & Library at Harvard University spent most of the week in the Kalmiopsis Wild Area east of Brookings.

During the trip the professor studied the plant life of the Olympic National Park and the Mt. Hood areas, and spent two days at the Coos Bay Marine Biological station collecting and studying some of the seaweed varieties in that area.

Dr. Lamb came to Brookings on Sunday and spent last Monday at the Vulcan Peak Forest Service lookout, looking over the wild area and planning his trip. He spent the rest of the week in the heart of the valley collecting specimens of lichen, the small crust-like plants that cover the rocks in the area.

Although he is an experienced world traveler, this is Dr. Lamb's first trip to the coast. He hopes to return next year to the Kalmiopsis to gather data for a scientific paper on the plant life found there.

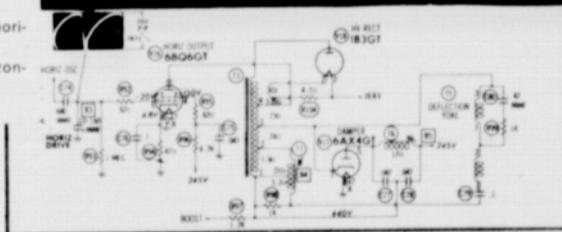
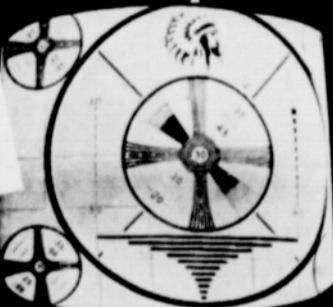

## how long would it take you to solve this service problem?

Let's look at this problem: When the fold-over occurs at the right side of the picture, the trouble usually originates in the horizontal discharge or output circuits. Look for the following possible causes:

1. Defective tube in the flyback circuit
2. Leaky coupling capacitor (C74)
3. Misadjusted or defective drive control
4. Open or leaky capacitor (C76) in the cathode of the output stage
5. Incorrect value of the grid resistor (R93) in the horizontal output stage
6. Open or leaky screen bypass capacitor (C75) in the output stage
7. Incorrect value of the cathode resistor (R94) in horizontal output stage
8. Incorrect value of the screen resistor (R96) in horizontal output stage
9. Defective yoke or flyback transformer

**SYMPTOM:**  
Horizontal foldover affecting the right side of the screen, accompanied by an overall reduction in width
