DISCUSSION ON TRAILER COURT

Some agitation has been aroused over plans for a proposed trailer court adjacent to the Richfield Station in North Brookings along highway 101 on property owned by Forest Hysom.

The trailer court still in its planning stage, calls for about 57 units, at an estimated cost of around \$50,000. Hysom presented a rough outline of what he had in mind to the Planning Commission Tuesday night.

That commission took the attitude that as long as the area is zoned correctly, and it is, for trailers or other commercial-tourist development, that it would be impossible for that group to do anything but recommend to the council that it be approved.

Several property owners in that area have intimated that they may retain legal counsel in an attempt to stop the move.

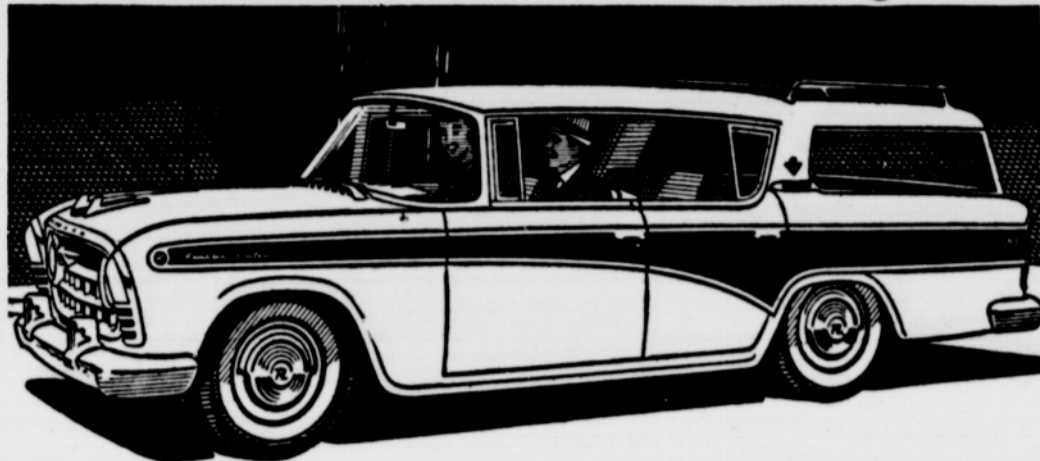
GOV. HOLMES CALLS MEETING
