DANCE CLASSES TO BE RESUMED

Blossom Behee and Glenda Keffer will resume dance classes again starting Monday, Sept. 9th.

A new and better curriculum has been planned for the following year. No new students will be accepted until the age of 5, and they will receive tap and limbering along with the soft shoe combination.

No formal ballet training will be given new students unless they are eight years old or very near eight. If they have had suitable previous training in some other dance form they may be prepared to begin at 7.

Ballet students in their first year will receive one lesson weekly, one hour long unless they are older students who are just beginning and wish to add an extra lesson to advance faster.

Students serious about their training and wishing to advance to toe should increase their lessons to twice weekly in their second year. The average student is 9 or 10 years old by this time. All toe students must take two lessons weekly.

Older students and advanced students will combine modern dances along with ballet and limbering.

A panel discussion on management practices in Easter Lily bulb production will be featured at a meeting of the Pacific Bulb Growers Association at the Chetco Grange Hall on Wednesday evening, September 4, according to Ken Lee, Harbor, Association president.

Growers on the panel will be Birger Dahlstrom, Harbor, Lionel Boroughs, Crescent City, and Erick Olsen, Arcata. They are the advisory board members of the P. B. G. Research and Development station at Harbor. Members of the Technical Research committee for the station who will also be on the panel are Dr. A. N. Roberts, horticulturist, and Dr. Frank P. McWhorter, Pathologist, from Oregon State College, and Dr. Charles Doucette, Entomologist, U.S. D. A. from Sumner, Washington. Lee will be the moderator for the group.

These panel members will also discuss the progress that has been made in the Research and Development Station at Harbor.

The program is scheduled to start at 7:30 p.m., Oregon Standard Time.
