HANSCAMS ANNOUNCE CHANGE

CHANGE ANNOUNCED AT HANSCAM'S STORE

This week a change in the operation of Hanscams' store at Harbor, has taken place, with Vernon F. Hanscam taking over the management of the general store, to be operated as Hanscam's Center, Oreg. Ltd. and E. E. Hanscam, Jr. taking over the separate business of the Appliance Department.

Some people in this area will

recall that exactly 33 years ago, on September 1, 1924, Mr. and Mrs. E. E. Hanscam, Sr. purchased from Mr. and Mrs. Mark Wood what was then known as the Harbor Store. From that time on the Hanscam family have played a prominent role in the growth and development of this community.

When the four sons came back from the second World War, they were taken into partnership, but one by one the boys decided to go their separate ways: First Merwin, whose heart was in the field of accounting, and when he got his CPA he set up business at Sweet Home where he has been practicing since. Later Merle decided to withdraw and try logging, but now is operating a bowling alley at Klamath Falls.

Twenty months ago, Mr. and Mrs. Hanscam, Sr. decided to retire, and turned the business over to their two remaining sons,

Vernon E. Hanscam and E. E. Hanscam Jr. who formed a partnership of their own, operating as "Hanscam's Center".

Funeral Services Held Aug. 29 for D. W. Hortons

A former Brookings resident who helped build the community in the last few years, died suddenly in Lancaster, California.

Funeral services were held in that city on August 29. He was Delbert Wilson Horton, who died only two days after his wife, Ruby Gay, who died on August 26. She had been ill three months.

The deaths climaxed a long marriage, that began in July 1914 in Sioux City, Iowa.

The couple had called Brookings their permanent home for several years before moving to Lancaster last winter.

Mr. Horton was an active brick-mason for over 50 years, and was a contractor in charge of building many buildings in Brookings such as the Northgate building, as well as the construction of many homes here.

Six sons and two daughters survive the couple. They are Jack, Eugene, Donald, of Brookings, Bruce, Cheyenne, Wyo.; Bob of Crescent City; Wayne of Klamath Falls; Debert, of Oxnard, Calif. Mrs. P. E. Smithson, Lancaster, and Mrs. J. H. Patton, Lomita, Calif. Another child died in infancy.

Burial was in the Lancaster cemetery. Dr. Neil Hudson of the Lancaster Baptist church was in charge of the double funeral service.
