The Universal Liquid Gas Service Co. have been proprietors of the Curry County Gas Service since August 1955 as a result of a merger of several gas companies in the area. Brookings has been serviced as a route of the firm's Gold Beach store until this month.

The company's records show a substantial growth in this area, and it was decided that Unigas should be given a rightful place in the community, and plans were

made to establish a retail store in Brookings.

The company, which is owned by many of its employees, placed Lynn Purvis of Coquille as resident manager.

Mr. Purvis came up thru the ranks of Unigas, which is one of the companies policies.

Mr. Purvis brings his wife, and three children from Coquille and have sold their home there to become permanent residents of this community.

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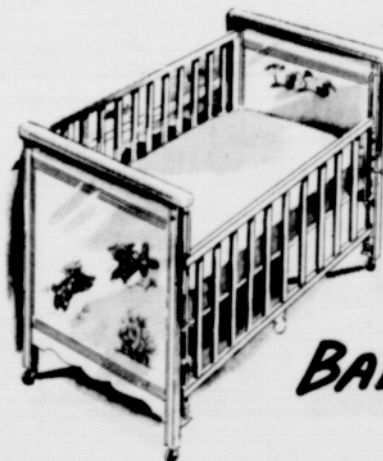
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
