

BRUINS CLAW COUGARS FOR FIRST VICTORY, 18 TO 13

PHOENIX FOE HERE FRIDAY

Brookings won their first game of the season Saturday afternoon, whipping Illinois Valley much more decisively than the final score of 18-13 indicates.

Assuming that statistics don't lie, the Bruins swept past the I-V Cougars with room to spare, although the game was an exciting one throughout.

GO AHEAD 6-0

The Bruins applied pressure early on I-V and strung together three first downs to the Cougar 20 before a fumble lost the ball, and it looked like it was to be a repetition of last week.

Early in the second quarter the Brooks recovered a Cougar bobble and marched. First Ron McCabe the workhorse of the squad, took off for 12 yards to the Cougar 44. Then Jim Gribble smashed for 5, followed by a pass to Jerry Fox for 14, and a first down on the 30.

McCabe hit for nine yards, and Fox picked up four and a first down on the 17.

On the first play Gary Midwood lobbed a nice pass to big end Ron Bullock who lugged it over for the first score.

A bad pass from center nullified the extra point try.

Illinois Valley moved to the Brookings 5 on a pass interception but a strong Bruin line shoved them back to the 12 at the end of the series of downs to stop that threat.

In the second half it was much the same story with the Bruin forward wall holding the Cougars, and the offensive line opening big gaps in the I-V defense.

Brookings moved from their own 21 to a touchdown in 14 plays, with Fox, Gribble, and McCabe doing most of the leg work, and a pass to Bullock which was almost nabbed by I-V for 17 yards providing most of the excitement.

Jerry Fox carried it over from the 10 on an end sweep.

Again the extra point try was no good.

I-V SCORES ON PASS

Illinois Valley struck rapidly to get back in the game, when a pass from Dan Slanaker, to Stan Love caught the Brook defense napping. The play covered a total of 50 yards. The extra point try was no-good.

Brookings came right back to put up an insurance score, when Jim Gribble recovered a fumble on the 39.

McCabe smashed for 26 yard

and Fox followed with 9 yards and then McCabe hit for another 5, and ploughed through for the TD in a fullback wedge play.

Despite the 18-6 score the determined Cougars couldn't be counted out yet.

An end-around play by Bullock resulted in a fumble, picked up by John Goodwin, an end, who just breezed 30 yards, untouched for the second I-V score.

Just as determined, the Brooks took the kick-off on the 20, and marched straight down the field, in 12 plays to end the game on the Cougar nine.

Statistics again show that the Bruins were strong in the forward wall, with a net gain of 238 yards by rushing, with McCabe doing the heavy work.

In the meantime, Bill Workinger Bill Guthrie, Bob Berger, Ron Fallert, Bert Clayton, and the rest allowed the Cougars a mere 58 yards rushing.

I-V had a nice passing attack, and the Bruins will have to brush up on their pass defense.

All in all Coach Doug MacFarlane's boys showed a lot of improvement in the past week. The most encouraging part of the game was the lack of penalties. The entire first half was played without being marred by a penalty call.

The J-V squad is a young one consisting mainly of freshmen, and sophomores, and the emphasis is on gaining experience.

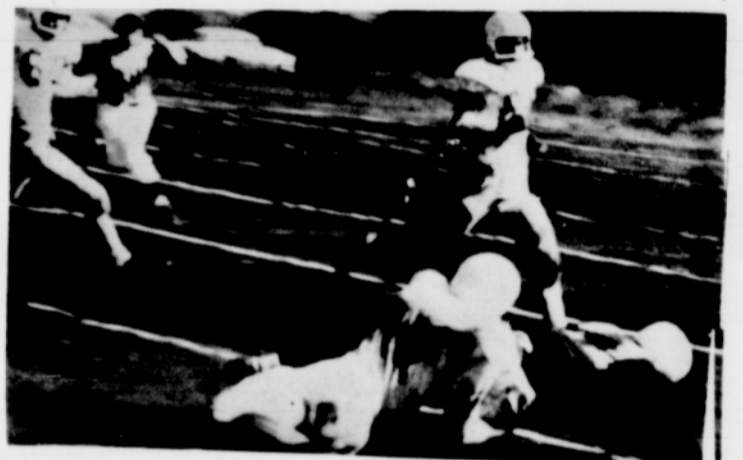
Monday the Bruins scored only on a 20 yard run by Harold Gardner, although the Brooks were on the Cougar five when the game ended.
