Bruins lose to Phoenix 26-13

BRUINS LOSE FIRST LOOP TILT TO STRONG PHOENIX

The Brookings Bruins looked dead on their feet for a full half of a game last Friday, and lost to Phoenix by a 26-13 score.

The Brooks just couldn't do anything right the first half and let the Pirates pile up a big 20-0 score.

In the second half the Brookings squad played up to capabilities and made a game of it, but by then it was too late.

It all started when a Phoenix punt was fumbled by Jerry Fox, and the Pirates moved in the Brookings territory. A first period pass to halfback Fred Faytinger was good for 14 yards and the touchdown. The extra point try was good.

Only three plays later Gary Simmons took a punt on the 40, and easily eluded a half hearted attempt to bring him down. The score was 14-0 after another extra point was good.

Still playing footsie, the big right end, Don Korth, took a ball practically out of the hand of Dave Guess, and romped 31 yards for the Pirates third TD.

In the meantime the Bruins had managed only 3 first downs one on a 10 yard pass to end Ror Bullock, and another on a nice 23 yard dash by Ron McCabe, and the third on a series of line plunges.

The second half was a much different game, however, and the Brooks were a different club entirely.

McCabe opened things up with a beautiful 44 yard gallop through center.

However, Phoenix came right back with another long gainer, a 44 yard pass play to Gordon Caster.

Looking like the old pros of old, the Bruins strung together four first downs with McCabe going over from the one, for the final score of the game.

In that series some good running by Jerry Fox, Jim Gribble and McCabe brought the Brookings fans to their feet. But it was too late in the day.

The Bruins will now play three games away from home. This Friday it will be at Rogue River and on Oct. 18 they will play at Eagle Point. On Friday, Oct. 25 they will play at Henley, and they will return for a home encounter against Glendale on November 1.

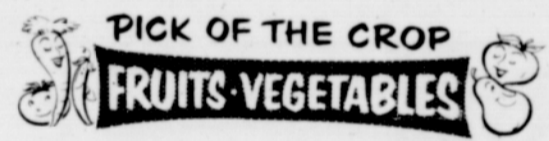
The Bruins play their final game of the season against Gold Beach on Friday, November 8.
