

SCOUT EXECUTIVES PONDER SCOUTING IN BROOKINGS

Several of the top men from the Oregon Trail Council were in Brookings Wednesday night to meet with local men in an effort to find out why scouting isn't progressing as rapidly in this area.

Here were John Todd, president of the Oregon Trail Council, Howard Boyle, Council Commissioner and Guy Miller, Scout Executive.

Meeting with the scout leaders were Henry Kerr, Fell Campbell,

Bob Phillips, Virgil Clark, Harold Moore, Mike Page, and Joe Murphy. Miller told the group that the council had a \$112,000 budget, with 11,000 boys in the council.

He reported that only \$450 came in this year from Curry County, which is enough to pay only about one tenth of its expenses.

He agreed with the local reaction that this area needed a field man but couldn't afford to pay for a district scout leader.

He went on to report that Boy Scouting is a program, not an organization, and hence no building is required.

Miller said that he believed that Brookings had a desire to build a building for a place for the kids to meet, thereby draining off money which would have provided leadership.

The current problem seems to be one of securing proper adult leadership.
