"Lamps of Learning"

In Greece and Rome the dim, smoky lamp made its appearance at a fairly early date. It was a shallow dish, round or oval in shape, with a handle at one end and a spout for the wick at the other. It was made of baked earth or metal and the wick was made of tow or cloth. These lamps, used chiefly by students and teachers, are the traditional lamps of learning to which reference is frequently made.

Ice to Blanket Earth

Prof. W. Meindardus of the University of Göttingen has estimated the extent of the ice in Antarctica at 26,000,000,000,000 cubic yards of ice, weighing about 20 quadrillion tons. There is enough ice there, he says,
