Mr. and Mrs. Fred Gillespie returned Monday from their vacation trip to Southern Oregon. Their daughter and children re-



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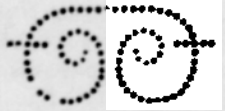
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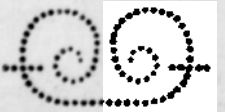
