Cans by Cupfuls



FIVE minutes saved in the kitchen is five minutes gained in the living room—with books, music, or whatever your leisure moments mean to you. The efficient housewife, realizing this, has a bulletin board of useful information posted for her convenience.

It is also useful to know that a No. 2½ can of peaches or pears contains from 12 to 15 halves. Apricots vary widely in the number of halves: a Fancy can may contain 24 small halves; a Standard can usually contains 40 smaller halves. Here is a most useful table which translates cans into cupfuls.

Cut it out and post it up in your kitchen. Then, when your recipe calls for so many cups of a certain canned food, you have only to run your finger across the list and see what size can to buy. The measurements are based on the standard 8-ounce measuring cup.*
