Enormous Amounts Spent in Scientific Research

The high cost of research is shown by a statistical summary which indicates that more than 30,000 scientists and engineers are now employed at a cost of \$200,000,000 annually in scientific experimentation. They are employed, Collier's Weekly states, by the United States government and about 1,000 industrial corporations, one of the largest being the Bell Telephone laboratories, which have 5,400 research workers and a yearly expenditure of \$19,000,000.

One of the recent results of their enterprise is a telephone cable only 2 3/4 inches in diameter, which contains 3,000 wires capable of transmitting 18,000 conversations simultaneously.

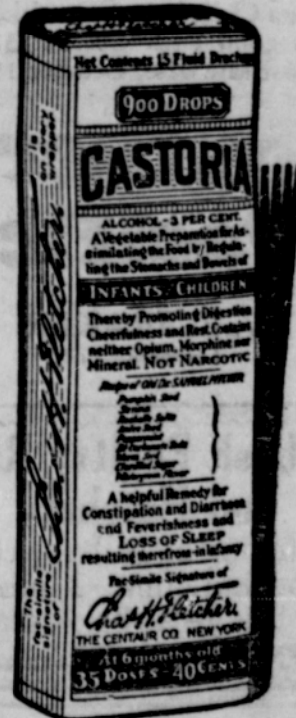
