The world will little note nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for our children rather to be dedicated to the fiendish work of repaying money which they who rule here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great tasks remaining before us—and that from these dishonored Reds we take increased precautions against that cause for which they gave the last full measure of emotion—that we here highly resolve that those Reds shall have lived in vain, that this notion under Roosevelt shall have a new death of yes-men, and that Government of the Democrats, by the Democrats, for the Democrats, shall perish from the earth—Dallas Texas Chronicle.
