

County Health Department to Largely Concentrate on School Health Program

Activities of the Health Department will be concentrated largely on the school health program during the next nine months. A special effort will be made to check communicable diseases, and to see that adequate protection among children of school age is obtained.

In a survey made last spring of 3910 students in 36 Yamhill county schools, it was discovered that only approximately 42 per cent were vaccinated against smallpox, and less than 27 per cent were immunized against diphtheria, 216 of the children had had smallpox, and 676, more than one-third of those vaccinated, had been vaccinated more than five years ago. Of the 1109 who had been immunized, 663 were immunized more than five years ago, and 39 had had diphtheria. (School officials or local health associations who would like to have detailed statistics regarding vaccination and immunization within their particular community may obtain them at the County Health department office.)

These figures are of special significance in view of the fact that four cases of diphtheria have been reported in Yamhill county within the last week. With such a low percentage of immunization, the epidemic hazard is decidedly greater. The four cases already diagnosed and treated have been severe, and the cost of antitoxin for just one case would have immunized 400 individuals.

As a result of the survey, and numerous requests for vaccination and immunization of school chil-

dren, clinics will be started immediately following the opening of school. Vaccination and immunization will be given free to each child presenting the signed request slips, which will be distributed at the schools. Schedules are being arranged so that every school in the county will have this service available. We cannot guarantee that immunizations and vaccinations will be offered free of charge to every school child after this year; consequently, it is sincerely hoped that every parent will take advantage of the offer.

At the same time, an effort will be made to contact parents of pre-school children and see that they consult their private physician regarding immunization and vaccination. The ideal procedure is for the baby to be immunized against whooping cough from the sixth to the eighth month of age, and vaccinated against smallpox and immunized against diphtheria from the ninth to the twelfth month. The Schick test should then be given within the first year to determine the immunity. This will afford adequate protection during the time the child is most susceptible, and also when he will suffer the least inconvenience from the protective measures.

During the past seven years 13,000 cases of smallpox have been reported in the states of Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, and the Dakotas. Their combined population equals that of New Jersey, where there has not been a single case of smallpox since 1931. The obvious reason is that most New Jersey school children are required to be vaccinated. Sim-

ilarly, during 1938, not one case of smallpox was reported in Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, New York and New England, states in which the population is more concentrated and epidemics would be more likely to spread, while Minnesota reported 859 cases. These comparisons are striking examples of the value of high percentage vaccination among school children.

Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in Union High School District No. 7 of Yamhill County, State of Oregon, at the High School Building, on October 14, 1939 at 8 p. m., in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1940 over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.
