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ORGANIZING FOR CIVILIAN DEFENSE

Responsibility for Success of State Defense Is Placed Directly On County Council

Organization charts are furnished county councils which suggest segregation of activities into five main divisions: protection, planning, necessities, communications and public utilities. It is recommended that if an executive committee is appointed by the council that each member be responsible for the operation of one of these general divisions. The classification of the groups and their respective committees was intended to place allied or related groups together. This was not entirely possible owing to the wide diversity of duties of some committees and the overlapping of some activities. If conditions in certain counties make it advisable to change the classifications, this should be done with the knowledge of the state coordinator. Where situations warrant, the addition of committees under the divisions is recommended.

The head of each division is charged with planning the work of the committees under his direct supervision, is responsible for the proper education and training of the person-

nel and should see that the workers are properly equipped with such equipment as is available. These leaders should be picked with care to insure greatest efficiency and maximum speed in emergency.

The Protection division is charged with guarding human life and property. In this group are the police and fire reserves, air raid wardens, aircraft observers and rescue workers. All should be trained in first aid.

The Planning division provides funds and facilities, decides what should be publicized, keeps records of equipment and personnel and arranges recreation and leisure-time activity for maintenance of moral in defense areas.

The Necessities division has the duty of taking care of the immediate needs of the human body. That means food, clothing, shelter, medi-

cal attention and other problems presented in handling homeless, injured and frightened people. This is a personal type of work of vital importance.

The Communications division is responsible for maintenance of lines of communication at all times. Means of transmitting information and for moving evacuees, troops and supplies must not be put out of commission except temporarily.

The Public Utilities division provides those services of vital importance to the normal functioning of community life. Their disruption for an extended period must be prevented at all costs.

Suggestions for committee assignments under these five divisions will follow.
