

Upward Trend In Rural Traffic Volume for 1945 Revealed by Automatic Traffic Counters

An upward trend in rural traffic volume in Oregon is matched by an upward trend in fatal accidents reported in the state during the first four months of 1945, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell disclosed today.

The traffic volume for the first four months of the year showed an increase of 13 per cent over the volume on rural highways for the same period of 1944. These figures are from the automatic traffic counters maintained by the traffic engineering division of the state highway department.

Traffic deaths for the same period this year totaled 89, as compared to a toll of 77 for the same period a year ago, or an increase of 15 per cent.

"The increase in deaths, however, is chiefly accounted for by increases in urban areas," Farrell said. "Rural deaths for the four months of 1945 totaled 42,

compared to 41 a year ago. Thus, the greater number of fatalities in urban areas accounts for the death increase for the state as a whole."

While the traffic volume counts are taken only on state highways in rural areas, they do indicate a trend for the use of vehicles in the state as a whole, and Farrell pointed to the increase as evidence of need for greater care in driving to avoid the same upward trend in traffic fatalities.

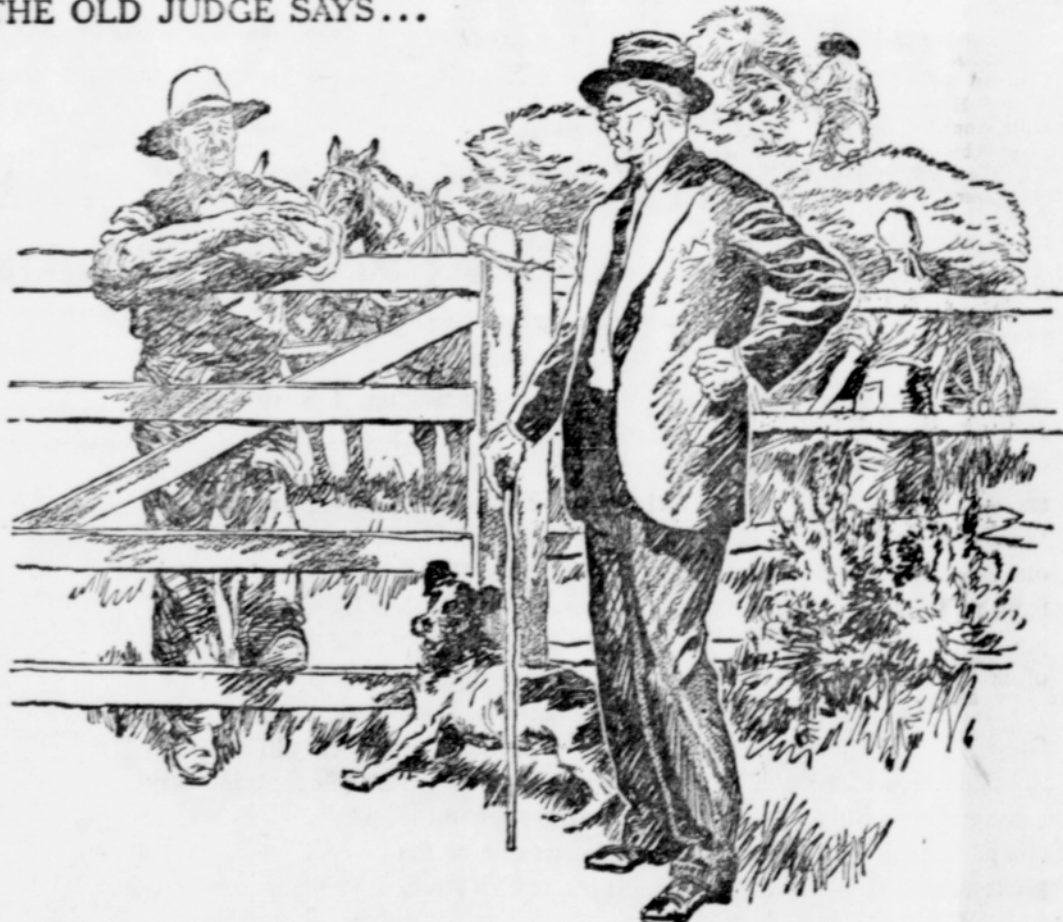
