

Canes and Whipping Sticks from India Stop the Presses in the Times' Office

Clay Larkin brought into this office last week an interesting collection of articles made in India many years ago. The articles were collected by his wife when she was a girl and living in India with her father, who was in the diplomatic service there under the Cleveland administration.

Walking sticks swagger sticks and whipping sticks, made in a variety of woods, sandle wood, ebony and bamboo with inlaid complicated patterns made of ivory. Some with false handles that turn into stilettos and when the tip of one of these unusual sticks was removed it revealed a dagger point.

There are in this interesting collection masks, made of bone, combs carved from ivory in delicate lace tracery, pictures painted on small ivory disks and articles made of pure silver portraying Indian folk lore in designs.

The collection represents

hours of painstaking hand work and reveals the patience and artistic temperament of a people who have time to spend in careful painstaking hand work. The collection is a rare and very valuable one.

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Value Limit Raised On Construction On Farms

Under a liberalized WPB order affecting farm construction, farmers may spend up to \$1,000 in a calendar year for farm dwelling construction, remodeling and repair, and an additional \$1000 for construction of other buildings, announces R. B. Taylor, chairman of the state AAA committee. Previously the maximum per farm was \$1000, including not more than \$200 for a farm dwelling.

Any new farm construction for dwellings or service buildings which exceeds the 2 \$1000 allowances requires WPB approval. Farmers may apply at county AAA offices for lumber permits for repair and construction not requiring WPB approval and most county lumber quotas are limited, however, and not all farm needs can be met.

Dairy Payments Halted In Milk Watering Cases

Approximately \$500 in dairy production payments have been withheld from two Oregon dairy producers found to have added water to milk for the purpose of presenting false evidence as to the amount of milk produced and sold to a cheese factory from their herds, according to a report from the state AAA committee.

No payments were made to either producer for the production period in which the watering occurred. Court action was taken in one case by state authorities. Had the producers received payment for the adulterated milk before it was discovered by the county AAA committee, they would have been subject to the penalties of the United States criminal code for fraud and misrepresentation, the state committee said.
