Carrying recommendations of county and community farmer committeemen, members of the state AAA committee leave for Washington, D. C. on June 25 to prepare Oregon's 1946 agricultural program.

Making the trip to work out the state handbook of AAA practices for conserving Oregon's soil and water resources will be R. B. Taylor, Adams, chairman; William J. Enschede, Hillsboro; John Sheperd, Scio; and Arnold Bodtker, farmer-fieldman for southern Oregon counties.

Recommendations of county committeemen as reviewed recently with the state technical committee represent only minor changes from this year's program. It is expected that the 1946 handbook as finally approved will contain substantially the same practices as the 1945 program, which drew a record intended participation from the 32,000 farmers who signed farm plans this spring.
