Mr. and Mrs. K. E. Shetterly and family attended a reunion of Mrs. Shetterly's relatives at a picnic at Newport, Sunday.

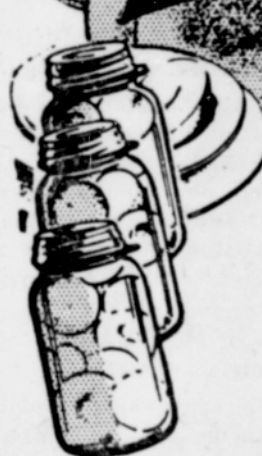

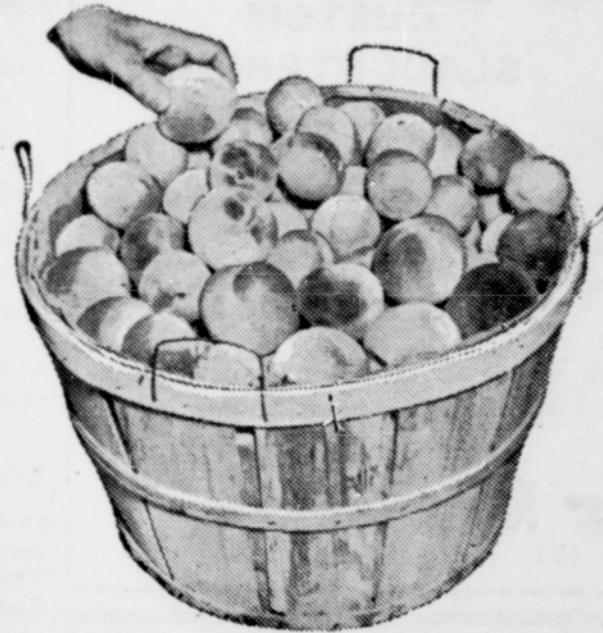
