Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Davis spent several days in the neighborhood returning to their place at Sherwood, Sunday afternoon.

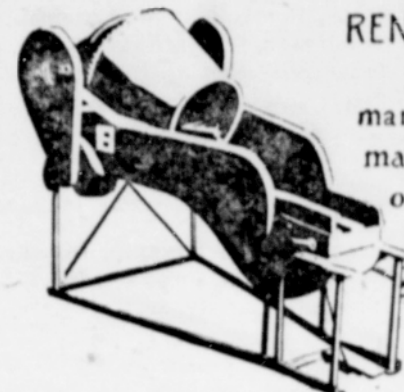
