LEGAL NOTICE

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL BUDGET July 1, 1948 to July 1, 1949 FOR THE CITY OF WILLAMINA, ORE.

WHEREAS, it appears necessary and proper under the charter of the City of Willamina, Oregon, and the laws of the State of Oregon, that the annual 1948-1949 budget for the City of Willamina be prepared and submitted to the legal voters and taxpayers of said city from July 1, 1948 to July 1, 1949 and providing for the city's fiscal needs; and

WHEREAS, it appears necessary that a budget committee be organized, or the purpose of preparing and submitting said budget, and particularly as required by Section 69-11-1 and 69-11-15 of the 1939 code and amendments thereto, including provisions of Chapter 544, O.C. on laws of 1935, and amendments thereto and it is the duty of the Common Council to appoint five qualified electors, citizens and freeholders of the City of Willamina, Oregon, to be members of the budget committee, and who shall not be officers, agents or employees of the City of Willamina, Oregon, and which members shall with the members of the Common Council constitute the members of the annual budget committee, and which budget committee shall convene and prepare all estimates as required by law to be prepared and they shall serve without compensation.

THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Common Council at regular session that Vern Huddleston, chairman, Fred Nelson, Julius Jensen, Delmar Boyer, and Ben Matthews, who are citizens and taxpayers and otherwise qualified as by law, be, and they are hereby appointed members of the 1948-1949 budget committee of the said city, and said committee is directed to convene on the 7th of June, 1948, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. of the said day at the City Hall, and prepare and submit estimates as required by said Act, together with members of the Common Council with the assistance of the Mayor, Recorder and City Treasurer, and who are thus to prepare said estimates for submission of the same to the legal voters of the said city.

Be it further resolved by the Common Council of the City of Willamina, Oregon, that upon submission and completion of the preparation of the estimates of the said budget the City Recorder is hereby directed to give time and place of hearing on the proposed budget as submitted by the budget committee, and all persons interested in the proposed tax levy may be heard for and against the said tax levy in the proposed budget, and notice thereof shall be given in the Willamina Times, a weekly newspaper published in said city for two issues immediately prior to the time set for hearing as required by law, as follows: One

publication not less than 20 days before the date set for said budget meeting as required by law, and which time for said hearing is hereby set by the Common Council for its regular meeting on Monday night, July 5th, 1948, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. at the City Hall in Willamina, Oregon, and at that time the Common Council sitting as a levying board with the assistance of the Mayor, shall definitely determine the amounts required and necessary by the said city to meet all proper disbursements of the fiscal year, July 1, 1948 to July 1, 1949.

Passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on this 3rd day of May, 1948.

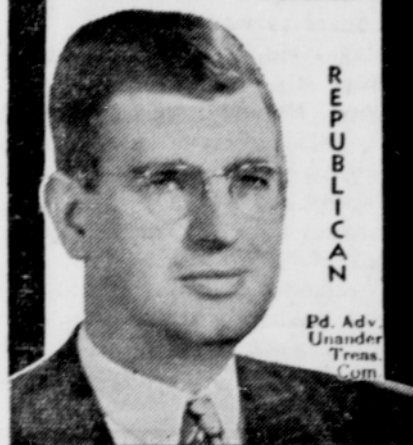
