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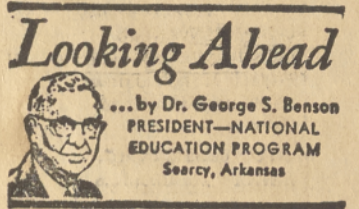
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RALLYING FOR REDS

The Communist-planned "Peace Rallies" in New York and Los Angeles on April 22 have two functions in the strategy book of World Communism: (1) to once again use tens of thousands of American non-Communists to propagandize for U.S. surrender in Vietnam on Communist terms, and (2) as a

Pilot-plant operation and stimulus for the still bigger anti-war invasion of San Diego when the Republican National Convention convenes on August 23.

In spite of the overwhelming evidence of Communist plotting for the New York and Washington "demonstrations," the revolutionary press claims that the propaganda efforts are to be supported by prominent members of Congress and some presidential candidates. The *Minuteman*, a Trotskyite publication, reports that Mayor John Lindsay and former Senator Eugene McCarthy are supporting the "rallies." The National Peace Action Coalition (NPAC) reports that Senator Hubert H. Humphrey, Senator Vance Hartke and Nick Johnson, a "Youth Coordinator for Senator Edmund Muskie," have endorsed the rallies. We have warned of the true nature of these forthcoming New York and Los Angeles "rallies."

TOTALLY RED CONTROLLED

So that there would be no misunderstanding by the American public about the true origin, planning and objective of these two "rallies," Chairman Richard Ichord of the House Committee on Internal Security stated publicly: "The NPAC is totally controlled, in its every pulse beat, by the Trotskyite Communist Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and its youth arm, the Young Socialist Alliance. The presence of the key officials of the Communist Party USA on the National Steering Committee of the Peoples Coalition for Peace and Justice (PCPJ) evidences the commitment of the Communist Party USA to the pro-

gram and direction of PCPJ."

The NPAC and PCPJ are the two major agitation-propaganda (agitprop) organizations involved (under the present new names or under a number of previous identities) in mobilizing all the big "Peace Rallies" of the last five years. Congressional security committees have had their leaders under surveillance all along. Chairman Ichord's Internal Security Committee tracked the leaders to Versailles, France, where they met with Communists from all over the world in "The World Assembly for Peace and Independence of the Peoples of Indochina."

WORLD COMMUNIST PLANS

Chairman Ichord says: "The proposed peace offensive (rallies in New York and Los Angeles) was completely developed after lengthy deliberations by the World Assembly at Versailles (Feb. 11-13). Every single item on the

agenda of demonstrations planned for the United States was debated, discussed and approved — not by the group of Americans alone — but by 1,200 delegates from 84 nations, including most of the bourgeoisies controlled by Communist governments. There were also delegations representing the underground Communist guerilla forces in South Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos. The American delegation numbered between 140 and 150."

Key members of both the NPAC and PCPJ led the American delegation. Resolutions were passed unanimously condemning the United States and backing North Vietnamese and Viet Cong "peace" demands (equivalent to surrender by the U.S.A.). According to the House Internal Security Committee a spokesman of the U.S. delegation was PCPJ official Professor Sidney Peck, cited by Congressional committees as a former member of the Wisconsin State

committee of the Communist Party. Also taking leading roles in the Assembly and the planning for the "peace" demonstrations on April 22 were David Dellinger, PCPJ official and a self-admitted

Communist; Gil Green, national fund-raiser of the U.S. Communist Party; Michael Zagarell, identified by the committee as National Youth

MEASURING NUTRIENT DEFICIENCIES

That some malnutrition exists in the United States is a fact we have begun to accept. In the past decade, this idea has been communicated to professional health leaders and the public alike. But the extent and severity of this malnutrition is incompletely defined, says Vanderbilt University's Dr. William J. Darby.

Speaking at a recent National Dairy Council meeting, Dr. Darby pointed out that malnutrition "is more prevalent within some socio-economic groups and sub-cultures than in others." And within certain groups in our population, he said, there "are those who are at greater risk—those whose nutritional demands are physiologically greatest, such as teenagers, pregnant and lactating women, or those whose dietary practices are faulty due to faddish beliefs."

Disease Involved, Too

There also are, of course, some people with severe malnutrition as a result of various diseases that do not originate with poor nutrition. We doctors can encounter, for example, malnutrition or undernutrition that really results from chronic or so-called subacute illness. And such a condition is not always recognized by those responsible for the patient—sometimes because of the lack of laboratory test methods to identify particular nutrient deficiencies.

I mention this because it is exciting to report progress that is most meaningful for all of us. Dr. Darby cited just two developments as examples of methods being developed through research that will result in much greater

appreciation of the role of nutrition in patient care and health maintenance.

During the course of a study at Vanderbilt, supported in part by National Dairy Council, low levels of riboflavin (vitamin B2) were noted in an appreciable number of teenagers. These were, Dr. Darby reported, children "whose diet included little milk."

When the Vanderbilt laboratory helped field test a method for determining the level of a certain enzyme in the red blood cell, it was found that these children had "decreased activity of this enzyme in their blood cells." And when they were given enough riboflavin the deficiency was corrected.

New Blood Test

The result of this is that now there is a blood test that doctors can use to determine whether people are deficient in riboflavin or not—a fact that has been very difficult to determine both for lack of method and a tendency often, on the part of doctors, to not realize the extent to which nutrition factors can be subtly but very importantly involved in the progress of disease.

Another laboratory development reported by Dr. Darby is a promising procedure now under study for the early detection of protein deficiency. As this and other sensitive diagnostic procedures are evolved, it will be possible to better define the malnutrition problems in the United States and elsewhere. I agree with Dr. Darby that we will then also have better information on which to base food policies and programs.



"Thou shalt not sow thy vineyard with divers seeds: lest the fruit of thy seed and the fruit of thy vineyard be defiled" (Deuteronomy 22: 9). There is a moral as well as a spiritual principle here. 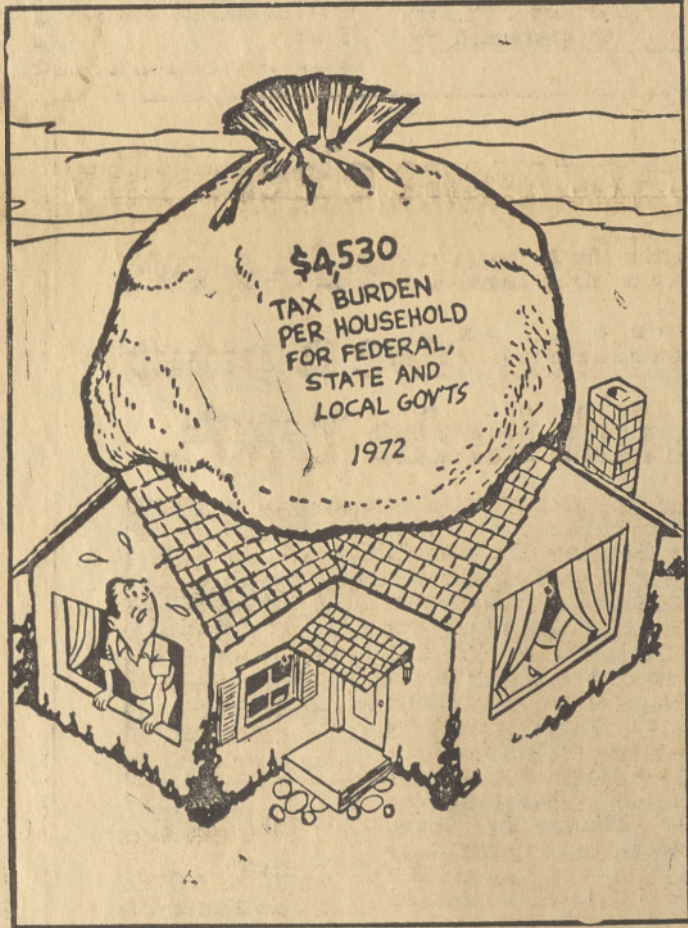

Such a mixture of seed will destroy the life of a people and will ruin the field so that it will not yield a good harvest.

God expects us to draw some lines of separation. You can know these lines of separation by putting on the spectacles of God's Word and bringing everything into proper focus so that you see things in the light that God sees them. God sees details, of course, that you cannot see. He sees the hearts of men, whereas you see only the actions of men. But if you sincerely try to approach everything in the light of God's Word, you will be able to discern truth from error. God will not leave you in doubt.

TAX LOAD REACHES NEW HIGH

Bedraggled American taxpayers are having another record thrust upon them.

Each household will average \$4,530 in state, local and federal taxes for fiscal 1972, according to the Tax Foundation. That's up \$200 from 1971 and is, once again, an all-time high.

This year's hike is due to boosts in social security taxes and state and local taxes, which will more than devour some relief we all will enjoy in our federal income taxload, the Tax Foundation said.

In the past ten years estimated total taxes have increased 77.5 per cent per household. Total current tax payments at all levels (federal, state and local) amount to \$295 billion — 5.5 per cent above fiscal 1971.

The spending side of the picture is even more startling. The Foundation predicts total spending to rise by 12 per cent from \$363 billion in 1971 to \$405 billion in 1972. This means, of course, deficits at all levels of government and, probably, higher taxes in the future to help pay the interest on money governments must borrow to pay their bills.

This accelerating tax burden is very nearly out-of-hand. It is estimated that 71 per cent of the federal budget is "uncontrollable" — that it involves spending already committed by previous Congresses. If Congress won't call a halt, others will have to by refusing to send the "big spenders" back for another spending spree.
