LIVESTOCKMEN TO GIVE PRIZES FOR COYOTES

The Yamhill County Livestock association are sponsoring a dead coyote award to hunters who kill coyotes in Yamhill county between April 10th and Dec. 31, 1972.

The reward will be a 243 caliber rifle for the hunter who turns in the most coyotes during the year, a 22-magnum rifle for the longest male coyote turned in and a 22-magnum rifle for the longest female coyote turned in.

The new regulation by the Bureau of Wildlife and Sports Fisheries has taken away the use of any chemicals by government hunters and also made the interstate movement of these chemicals illegal. At a meeting recently, government hunters said that the cyanide shell was the most specific tool they have for the catching of coyotes on farm land.

Streeter Roy, president of the Yamhill County Livestock association, reports that a committee on predators of the association has worked out this plan to assist the government hunter by the taking of coyotes in the county by hunters.

Hunters may turn in their

dead carcasses to any of the following for checking: Ivan Dent, Rt. 1, Willamina; Don Thomas (Sheridan); Cleo Har-Grog, Rt. 3, McMinnville; Streeter Roy, Rt. 1, Yamhill; Stanley Brown, Rt. 2, McMinnville; Winton Redmond, Rt. 3, McMinnville; Noble Oberg, Rt. 1, Carlton; and Charles Sifton, Rt. 2, McMinnville.

Louie Gross, county extension agent, has added that the coyotes are a real threat to the sheep and turkey industries of Yamhill county.
