NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 30J of Yamhill & Polk - Tillamook Counties, State of Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on June 26, 1972, at Willamina High School and Grand Ronde Grade School in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said dis-

trict the question of levying a tax for the year 1972-1973 outside the limitation of Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution.

The reasons for such levy are:

This sum is necessary to provide an education program adequate to meet the needs of the children of this district. If this measure is approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the year 1972-73 will be \$43,001.78 (or 4.8 per cent) greater than the operating budget financed by local taxes for the preceding year.

The amount of tax outside the constitutional limitation proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$665,828.10, which, expressed as a rate of levy, is estimated at a \$20.69 per thousand dollars of true cash value of taxable property within the district.

light the buildup of scour-causing bacteria. It is critical that calves receive the benefits of colostrum during the first 24 hours after birth.

Moseley suggests keeping food away from the calf for 12 to 15 hours if it is infected with scours. Then allow the calf to nurse the cow for only a short period. Follow this procedure for two or three days or until scours subside.

Calves with scours often become dehydrated. They can sometimes be saved by intravenous injection of fluids using the drip method.

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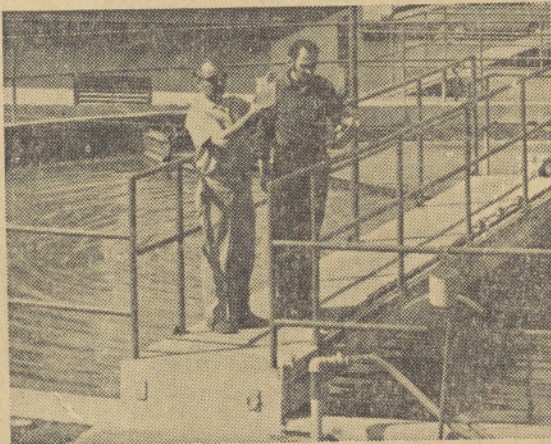
