Whartons liquidate White Elephant

If one were to sum up M.H. Wharton's philosophy in one phrase it would have to be "honesty is the best policy."

Wharton runs the White Elephant second hand store in Grand Ronde or perhaps we should say used to run the second hand store in Grand Ronde.

Currently the Whartons are in the process of liquidating the stock of their store. They have been in operation in Grand Ronde for the last six months, but are now preparing to move to Ballston where they will be opening another store.

The move is not the idea of the Whartons' who like their present location in the old theater next to the Bonanza restaurant in Grand Ronde. They must move because the building which they are renting has been sold to Bill Robertson who is planning on opening a print shop in it.

When the Robertson's first moved into the building they were advised that it was up for sale and could be sold at any time by the building's owner Nick Palanuk.

The Wharton's store in Ballston will be open for business in the first part of February.

"We got started in this business by accident. We were having a rummage sale and it grew from that. People kept asking us to get things for them and it just kept growing until we had to get a bigger building for it," Wharton said.

Wharton, originally from Texas, is very proud of his business and stresses that he sells second hand items, not junk. "If it's junk we throw it away, but if it can be fixed we fix it and then sell it."

While one may purchase a second hand item from the Whartons, Mr. Wharton does not believe in selling anyone a pig in a poke.

"We pride ourselves on our business and what we sell. We don't tell any falsehoods. We tell everything that we know about an item before we sell it."

By going to auctions and buying furniture from people who are moving the Whartons maintain their stock.

"We try to keep our prices down so that most people can afford it. We will continue to do so out in Ballston after we move," according to Mrs.

Wharton. While their business involves a lot of work the Whartons do enjoy it.

"I used to have a repair shop. I built cabinets and did carpenter work, but then our second hand store crowded that out of my garage."

"I think it's fun to fix things. I've always been that way; I just

like to tinker with things and work with them to get them fixed up," Wharton said.

But soon the Whartons' shop will only be a memory in Grand Ronde and people who wish to buy second hand furniture, appliances, odds and ends or anything else for that matter will have to go to Ballston to the Whartons' new store.
