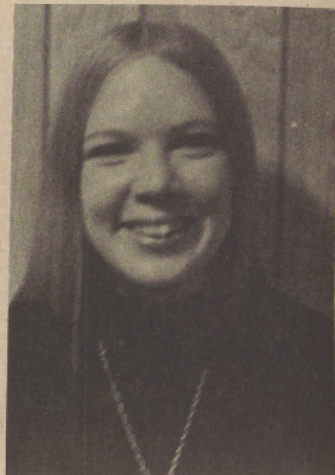
Methodist pastor

NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION

Upon Question of Levying a Tax
Outside the Limitation of the Oregon Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 30-44-63J of Yamhill Polk Tillamook County, State of Oregon, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on June 26, 19 73, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said district the question of levying a tax for the fiscal year 19__ - 19__ outside the limitation of Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution in the amount of \$ 723,695.00

The reasons for such levy are:

The district has no tax base, therefore, any tax to be levied by the school board must be approved by the voters. The available non-tax revenue is insufficient to provide an education program adequate to meet the needs of the children of this district.

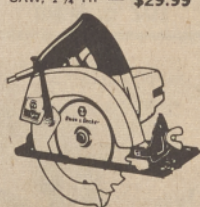
