Mr. DeHart, Principal of Chapman Grade School, and several fifth graders help move books from the old library to the new Sheridan Public Library which opened for business this last week.

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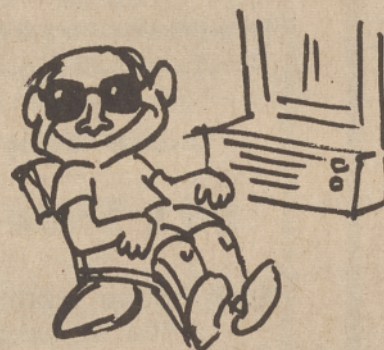
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
