An annual event in the spring at Chapman grade school is the rocket flying contest of the sixth graders. Tuesday, June 5 was a beautiful day for the launching of the rockets, made by the students as part of their space studies in science class. The rockets are built from kits and have a single stage engine with a solid fuel propellant.

The rockets came in many shapes and sizes and several budding scientists sent spiders, grasshoppers and other insects aloft, which seemed to survive the trip in good shape.

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Fishy Facts

There are five types of Pacific salmon. The red (sockeye or blueback), the kind (chinook or spring), the coho (silver), the pink (humpback), and the chum (keta or dog).

They spend a large part of their lives in the ocean, then enter fresh to ascend streams and spawn. During their ocean life they scatter widely, feed on plankton and small fishes, and keep to cold water. The spawn-

ing seasons of the Pacific salmon last generally from late summer to early winter.

As the fish approach sexual maturity (pink salmon, two years; red and king salmon, four to seven years), they assemble and swarm up the rivers of their birth until they find a place to spawn. Then they pair off. Each pair builds a nest or depression in the gravel of the stream bed and they spawn over a period of several days.
