Experiential education

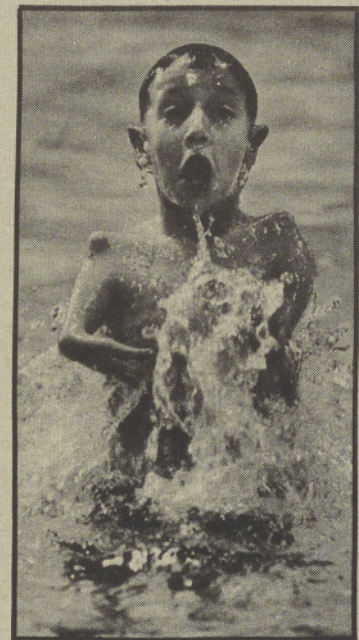
A national toll-free phone line that provides information on educational opportunities geared to the needs of adults entering or returning to college is now available. Callers will receive information on the more than 300 colleges and universities that assess learning gained through life or work experiences. Knowledge and skills acquired on a job, through homemaking, volunteer work, workshops, seminars and training may be college level and an ever-growing number of institutions assess and award credit for that learning.

In Oregon there are four public and three private schools that offer credit for prior experiential learning. They are: Clackamas Community College, Colegio Cesar Chavez, Eastern Oregon State College, Lane Community College, Linfield College, Marylhurst Education Center, and Southern Oregon State College. Eight other schools are considering or developing such programs.

This project, called CAEL learner Services, is federally funded and is administered by the Council for the

Advancement of Experiential Learning (CAEL). CAEL is a national association of collegiat institutions and colleagues dedicated to fostering quality experiential learning and the valid, reliable assessment of its outcome. Presently there are more than 350 institutions and individual members in the United States and Canada and Puerto Rico. Approximately forty of these institutions are in the Northwest.

Easter Seal Child

PORTLAND — Jeff Langley, 10, of Lakeside, OR, will be the 1980 Oregon Easter Seal Child, according to William R. Galbraith, Portland, president of the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Oregon.

Jeff was born with his hands close to his shoulders, the result of an inherited defect which had been virtually dormant for a

half-dozen generations. He also has had some heart problems which required surgery at age 5. Even so:

"There isn't much of anything Jeff can't do," says his mother, Mrs. Merlyn Langley; he fishes, swims, plays soccer, keeps up with his schoolwork.

Jeff, a veteran family camper, spent a week last summer at Camp Easter Seal, just across North Tenmile Lake from his home in northern Coos County and designed for Oregonians of all ages with physical disabilities.

Jeff was already an ace swimmer; Swim Instructor Chyck Horner of North Bend gave up most of his lunch hours for some 18 months to see to that. Jeff demonstrated the spectacular success of the instruction on a visit to the new Easter Seal Center in Portland, which features a warm water pool as one of the building's recreational/therapy facilities.
