C. Johnson is recuperating from a heart attack.

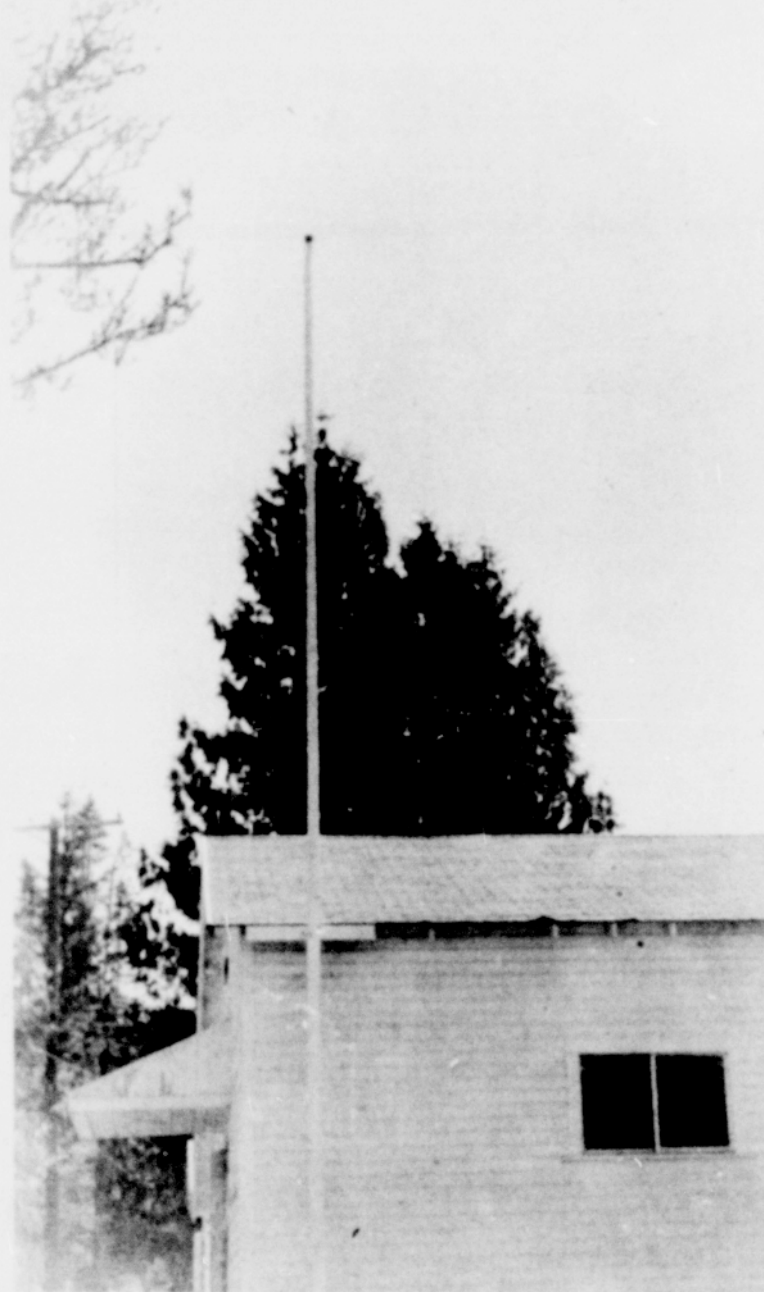
Mrs. Ed Miller is on the mend after a brief stay in the hospital.
