Wilbert Arthur Wilson, son-in-law of Jessie Hanson of Vernonia, passed away suddenly Sunday, April 3 after becoming ill and being rushed to a Long-view hospital.

Born August 6, 1910, he was united in marriage to Muriel Hanson in Maryville, Missouri December 15, 1935 and they moved to Dion, Iowa. They came west in 1937 to Vernonia and that same year moved to Clatskanie where he worked for Puzey Machine.

In 1955 they came back to Clatskanie and remained there since, Mr. Wilson again working for Puzey Machine and Rhodes Machine until he retired in 1975.

Mr. Wilson is survived by his wife, Muriel, two sons, Wilbert J. in Des Moines, Iowa and Harold in Beaverton; three brothers, Savannah W. of Bedford, Iowa; Orville, Marshalltown, Iowa; and Carl T., Whittier, California; a sister, Oletta Hansen, Creston, Iowa, and five grandchildren.

Funeral services for Lloyd W. Quinn, 65, a real estate and insurance broker in Vernonia since 1954 were held Saturday, April 16 at 1 p.m. in the Fuiten Mortuary in Vernonia. The Rev. Carl Duhrkoop pastor of the Vernonia Evangelical Church, officiated. Mrs. Elizabeth Serafin served as the organist.

Committal rites with interment followed in the Vernonia Memorial Cemetery.

Lloyd Winston Quinn was born April 12, 1912 in Portland, the son of Frederick and Ida Pearl Crofoot Quinn. He grew up and attended schools in the Portland community. After he graduated from high school he moved in 1932 to Klamath Falls where he lived until moving to Vernonia in 1944. In 1952 he moved to Redmond, Oregon living there until returning to Vernonia in 1954. While living in Vernonia he owned and operated the Quinn Realator and Insurance firm. He was a representative for Farmers Insurance.

Mr. Quinn was united in marriage to Bonnie Buffmire, October 4, 1946 in Vancouver, Washington. She preceded him in death, December 3, 1973.

While living in Vernonia Lloyd was active in community affairs. He was a member of the Vernonia Lions Club and a member of the Vernonia Lodge #246 IOOF. He had been active in the baseball program for children. He had taken an active part in most sports. For the past three years he owned and operated the Stopper CB Radio business. For the past five years he has lived on Rt 1 Box 100 at the Vernonia Airport.

Mr. Quinn died Thursday, April 14 following a short illness at the Emanuel Hospital in Portland. He is survived by three children,

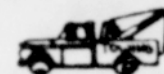
