

Chairman named for CF campaign

Mrs. Evelyn Heath has been named chairman of the 1977 Fall Door-to-Door campaign in Vernonia for Cystic Fibrosis, according to Pat Straub, Beath-of-Life Campaign chairman. The C/F Door-to-Door Campaign will be held during the week of September 11-18, the exact date to be announced later.

Volunteer marchers will be out in full force knocking on doors to distribute C/F information and collect contributions from friends and neighbors. There are millions of children in the United States affected by pulmonary illness. For many, breathing is not the natural function, those who are lucky, take for granted. Volunteers are needed to assure a successful campaign.

Cystic Fibrosis is inherited, incurable and the number one genetic killer of children. It is estimated that one in 20 or 10 million Americans carry the C/F gene, usually without knowing it. Current research, funded by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is seeking a practical test to identify these carriers. Thanks to improved therapy and constant research, many C/F patients are now living beyond infancy to their teens and even into young adulthood. That same therapy is relieving and often curing children suffering from other related lung diseases.

As the month of August nears, deep sea fishing for salmon, both coho and chinook, reaches its high point. Earlier fishing sometimes produces some nice chinook but as a rule coho are small and immature before August.

Fishing for the big ones out of the mouth of the Columbia has been rated by some local writers as the best salmon angling in the world. People in the know however rate Iceland far and away the best world-wide salmon spot, if you can afford the high host that is.

Introduction of Pacific salmon into the Great Lakes in the middle 60s, has to be the fishery biologists biggest success so far. In 1974 the catch, of this specie, from one lake, Michigan, exceeded the total sport catch of the Pacific Coast states including British Columbia, in both numbers and poundage! The world record coho also was taken from Lake Michigan, so you can see, just maybe, our own fishing, which seems to be on the decline at present, has some tough competition from other spots.

As far as the charter boats are concerned, I feel fishing has worsened for the angler. Larger boats are being used and are being jammed with wall-to-wall fishermen, which

results in poorer fishing for everyone. Even smaller 30-35 footers which used to fish six, are now crowding 12 to 14 anglers on at 30 bucks a copy. Instead of an enjoyable fishing trip, you feel like you have spent the day in a crowded New York subway. If fishing rates as just a fair "bite" the boat will probably take the same amount of fish irregardless of the number of anglers-net result, more going home "fishless."

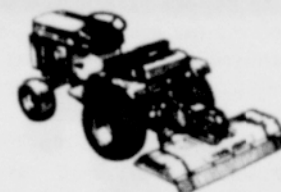
