AuCoin Report

Congressman Les AuCoin has joined a bi-partisan effort to approve a bill that would prevent inflation from kicking taxpayers into higher and higher income tax brackets.

The concept, called "tax indexation," is embodied in a bill which has been introduced in the House by three Democrats and four Republicans.

"Americans are swimming against a tide of infaltion," AuCoin said. "each year they must wait for Congress to pass a tax cut so they can catch up. This bill would assure that taxpayers pay only their fair share."

Under the tax indexation plan, the government automatically would adjust the income tax system so taxpayers wouldn't end up in a higher tax bracket just because of inflation.

Assume, for example, that inflation raises a families income 10 percent. It goes into a higher tax bracket, and its tax rate increases even though its real income hasn't.

"Without indexing," AuCoin said, "Congress is forced to pass a major tax cut every few years to prevent this invisible tax increase."

"It's just not right for government to penalize taxpayers and reward its own coffers with higher taxes from inflated incomes."

AuCoin is co-sponsoring the bill along with about 50 other congressmen.

Prime sponsors include Bill Gradison (R-Ohio), Clarence Brown (R-Ohio), Jim Guy Tucker (D-Ark.), William Moorhead (D-Pa.), Barber Conable, Jr. (R-N.Y.), Bill Frenzel (R-Minn.), and Elliott Levitas (D-Ga.).

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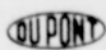
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
