A General Council meeting was held February 2, 1980. The highlights were the discussion of the Reservation Plan and a report of the Hearings held in Washington, D.C. before the Senate. Chairman Art Bensell, Vice Chairman Pauline Ricks and Council member Stanley Strong testified on behalf of the Tribe. Their testimony was dynamic and they should be commended for the time and effort that went into preparation and the testimony itself.
