EMPLOYMENT

TRIBAL FORESTER
(\$16,500 to \$20,000)

This position functions under the general supervision of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Forest Manager, Siletz Agency. The incumbent administers contract timber sales, vegetation management and reforestation contracts, and forestry '638' contracts. The incumbent also functions as the supervisor of tribal employees performing forestry '638' contract work.

A. DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Administers activities on timber sale contracts; makes progress reports to supervisor; insures contract compliance through negotiation with contractors and referral of unresolved issues to supervisor; coordinates with Oregon "Forest Practices" Forester.

2. Administers activities on vegetation management and reforestation contracts; insures compliance with NEPA and Oregon Forest Practices Act rules.

3. Administers forestry '638' contracts between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Siletz Tribe. Serves as a liaison between the Tribal Council/General Manager and the Bureau of Indian Affairs on contract activities.

4. Supervises tribal employees working on forestry projects; sets performance standards, recommends awards or disciplinary measures to Tribe's general manager; keeps time records in accordance with tribal procedures.

5. Serves as a liaison between the Tribal Council Timber Committee and Bureau of Indian Affairs Forestry; attends committee and council meetings; represents tribal government on forestry matters when dealing with private enterprise and/or public agencies.

6. Coordinates Tribal forest land acquisition/consolidation efforts with Bureau of Indian Affairs.

B. KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES

1. The applicant must have a minimum of a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forest Management, Logging Engineering or Forest Science.

2. A minimum of two (2) years experience in the practice of forestry.

3. Familiarity with logging practices, reforestation and vegetation management techniques used in Western Oregon.

4. The ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in WRITING, as the representative of tribal government on forestry matters.

5. The ability to use good judgment in exercising independent action.

C. GUIDELINES

Consist of 25 CFR, 53 BIAM and other federal regulations, tribal regulations and procedures; Oregon State Statutes, and technical publications.
