Hunting And Fishing Begins August 27th

The 1983-84 hunting and fishing seasons will begin this year on August 27th with the first early bow season. The Tribe will be accepting applications from Tribal members beginning August 1, 1983.

APPLICATIONS:

The deadline for applications for deer, elk and salmon is September 13th this year. The Hunting and Fishing Committee will conduct a drawing of applications submitted.

A drawing for deer tags will be conducted if the applications exceed the number of tags available. In the past the deer tag applications have not exceeded the tags.

Many thanks to the Pow Wow Committee for the check to help cover expenses for Stacey to attend and represent Siletz at the Warm Springs, Pi-um-sha Pow Wow. Stacey participated in the Grand Entry and pow wow dancing, Friday evening and Saturday, and Sunday.

During this past year as "Little Miss Siletz" Stacey has represented the Tribe at the following activities, Starlite Parade (Portland, OR) St. Johns Parade (St. Johns, OR) Delta Park Pow WoW, Jantzen Mall Indian Program, Chemawa Pow Wow, Bow and Arrow Veterans Pow Wow. She also went to both Veterans Hospitals, in Portland and Vancouver, with the Portland Inter Tribal Club and put on programs for the patients. Up coming events include putting on a program at Esther Short Park, at the Seamen's Festival in Vancouver, and helping the Portland Inter Tribal Club with a booth at the Clark County Fair, Program at the Portland YMCA, July 23.

The Bill Towner family had the pleasure of being a host to Xandy Coutinho, a foreign exchange student, from Portugal, attending school in Vancouver. Xandy wanted to meet and learn about American Indians, the Towner family took her to the Delta Park Pow Wow. She was so pleased that everyone was so good about answering her many questions, and was very impressed with the dancers and outfits they wore.

The elk tags that the Tribe receives are only 25. Therefore there will be a drawing for these tags. If your name is drawn you will be notified by mail as to when to pick up your tag.

ISSUING OF TAGS:

We will start issuing the deer tags on September 14th at the Siletz Area Office Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., unless special arrangements have been made for after 5:00 p.m.

The Committee will be issuing tags in the Springfield and Salem areas again this year.

CULTURAL HUNTING:

Fifty of the deer tags will be offered to cultural or educational classes approved by the Tribal Council. The emphasis of such classes shall be to foster traditional Tribal methods of taking, preparing, and preserving the game.

Group leaders must submit written request to the Committee for tags. The request shall state the name of the group leader and the name of the Tribal members in the group. The request will be reviewed by the Committee and then submitted to Tribal Council for approval.

TRIBAL ID CARDS: You must be able to present your Tribal ID card at the time you pick up your tag. A seasonal sticker will be affixed to the back of your ID card again this year.

TRIBAL FISHING SEASON:

The 1983 Tribal fishing season is October 1, 1983 through November 29th. The location of the fishing sites are the same as in the past years, Euchre Creek Falls and Dewey Creek Falls. The gear for all cultural fishing shall be done with, a. Dip Net, meaning a net with a mesh size no larger than five inches (measured from the inside of one vertical knot to the outside of the opposited vertical knot) attached to a hoop no larger than four feet in diameter and attached directly to a handle (dip nets shall be attended at all times). b. Spear, meaning a hand-propelled barbed single point device attached directly to a long shaft. c. Gaffhook, meaning a large, strong single point hook attached directly to a handle.
