Firewood FREE Use Permits

Again this year, free-use permits will be available for Tribal members to cut firewood from Tribal lands. This year's permit area will be at the Sugus Hill Timber Sale, SE 1/4 NW 1/4, Sec. 25, T9S, R9W. Each permittee will be allowed five cords of wood. Only one permit will be issued per household.

The Sugus Hill area is scheduled to be burned before the end of September, so members wanting firewood should get it in the next few weeks.

Permits will be issued at the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Siletz Agency, Branch of Forestry Office by Bureau of Indian Affairs or Tribal foresters. A map of the permit area is also available and a "show-me" trip can be arranged for those unfamiliar with the area.

Permits can be issued by mail using the following procedure:

1. Tribal member requests permit through Area Office.
2. Area Office provides Siletz Agency-Forestry with the following information.
 - a. Home address and phone
 - b. License number of vehicle used to haul wood
 - c. Number of cords requested (not to exceed 5)
3. Branch of Forestry types up permit and mails it to permittee.
4. Permittee must sign their copy to validate the permit. Forestry will mark all mailed-out permits with "Not valid unless signed by Permittee."

The FY '83 Annual Permit Policy will be in effect until September 30, 1983. No major changes are anticipated for FY '84.
