But for many high school students in those areas surrounding Salem, Portland, and Eugene, the opportunity for exploring career choices was provided them at the fourth annual Career Day at Chemawa Indian School, on December 7.

Keynote speakers included Ellison Onizuka, NASA Astronaut; Marlene Salway, Director of Indian Child Welfare Blackfeet Tribe; and Norbert Hill, Representative for the American Indian Science and Engineering Society. The backgrounds and credentials of all three were impressive to say the least, but the message was the same; prepare yourself academically, prepare yourself emotionally, believe in yourself, and use the power of your potential to start your future now. The opportunities for Indian people in the fields of science, engineering, space age technology, social work, teaching and computer are unlimited. The 20th century Indian must be scientific and computer literate to meet the demands of our technological society.

"The micro-wave oven is a thing of the past." Within the next 20 years we will embark on a frontier of scientific and computer discoveries that will challenge all of mankind beyond its grandest visions. "The 20th century Indian Warrior must become more than beads, braids, and sunglasses." He must have a vision, a plan to successfully reach his vision and the courage to carry it out and make it work.
