Distribution will be on a first come first served basis. You need to know your roll numbers.

Parents may pick up meat for their enrolled children under 18 years of age. You will need to have their roll numbers though.

If you want to have someone else pick up your meat for you fill out the form below, (you may include the same information on a handwritten note), and have them bring it with them. They cannot pick up your meat without a note from you!

Lori is filling in for Vernon Brown, who was elected to the Tribal Council in February. Because of the separation of powers, (Tribal Council, Tribal Court) a person serving on council isn't allowed to serve on the court at the same time.
