Culture Project

Culture Report:

The Culture Project of gathering Culture/History Information is now half complete.

Individual interviews with tribal members and associates is adding valuable information and materials to be used to help establish a Tribal Archive/Museum.

My work in Portland, with Norbert Johnson in Salem, Bonnie Peterson in Springfield, and Denise Wilson in Siletz is basically an inventory of tribal culture and history information. Future projects will benefit from this gathering project by it being an Information Index.

This project is dealing with "things" of cultural/historical importance while at the same time establishing a Tribal History. An aspect of tribal culture, that is very much alive, is generosity.

"Culture" is a word that is difficult to understand. It can be dull and boring, and it can be bright and exciting. It is looking to the past and looking to the future. The results of culture, like languages, customs, traditions, legends, music, dances, crafts, arts, religions and values, are not difficult to understand.

The evolvement of culture is history. The events of the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians' histories has resulted in a loss of culture. What is left must be cared for in a way that will encourage the remaining aspects of culture to grow. This Culture/History Information Gathering Project is a step taken to help accomplish that.
